Dear Friends & Donors of Toe Care

We are the close of 2005 and it is time for us at We Care to remember each and every one of you with a heart filled with gratitude and appreciation. It is because of your generosity in giving that we have been able to reach out to hundreds of people who need help. We **thank you** for truly being a **person who cares**.

The generosity displayed by our friends and donors during the year 2005 has been very encouraging. Your continued financial support to towards the objects of We Care has helped us to move forward with confidence and to take up projects in favour of the needy.

Owing to many difficulties we were not able to publish the newsletter last year. Further, because of rising costs in printing and postage, we have decided to send **e-newsletters** to all our friends, donors and benefactors from January 2006. It will be just one page of information about the work undertaken by us.

During the year we focused on two main programmes: education & disability.

**Education assistance:** We were able to reach out to over 600 children, providing them with assistance towards their education: books, uniforms, mid-day meals, etc. Students from St. Paul's High School and Joseph's Girls High School, Belgaum; St. Maryknoll High School, Barkur, Udupi; St. Benedict's Higher Primary School, Bangalore; Franciscan Institute Higher Primary School, Bangalore; Basic Education for Social Transformation, Wakaner, Gujarat; and other local schools received financial assistance towards books, uniforms, tuition fees, mid-day meals, transport and other expenses.





We have also kept our commitment to assist in the education of five girls taking up studies in nursing. Those who have completed their studies have expressed their immense gratitude to We Care for the assistance granted to them.

The year 2004 has seen an new venture begin called *Hands of Hope Programme* – for the education of 350 – 400 primary school children from the Benedictine Higher Primary School, Kengeri, on the rural outskirts of Bangalore. The programme is supported by Hands of Hope Ltd., Ireland and monitored by their volunteers.

During the year We Care also conducted a capacity building programme in Accountancy and Management for people working in NGO's. The programme was conducted at Sadbhavana with the assistance of the Carmelite Friars. The programme was intended as a fund raising activity as well as an outreach to assist NGO's in their work.

The year also saw the blossoming of the Community Based Rehabilitation Programme (CBR) for persons with DISABILITY (PWD's). We have identified 399 persons with different types of disabilities in a small population of four municipal wards. The pwd's were guided to the Government hospital for examination and certification. Awareness programmes have been initiated in the area for all groups of people including school children, women, teachers, and the public. Many pwd's have started receiving government assistance by way of passes for trains, buses, self-employment schemes, etc.

Through the CBR programme, many PWD's have started receiving proper assistance towards their rehabilitation. During the year we have distributed wheel chairs and hearing aids to the more needy ones. We have also helped some to secure crutches and surgical correction. The pwd's were encouraged to participate in sports and games, drawing competitions, rallies, etc., conducted by the Government of Karnataka and other NGO's. Integrated camps for children (able and disabled) were conducted to provide an opportunity for the pwd's to become more socially and psychologically adept.

Reaching out to those in need of health care has also been a concern for us. Medical costs are rising by the day and the poor find themselves at the receiving end. We now have two funds created to assist people who need medical care: Vida and Douglas Memorial Health Care Fund and Karen Maryann Pereira Memorial Lukemia/Cancer Fund. Karen died of cancer at a very tender age of 33 years and expressed her dying wish to create a fund for the benefit of cancer patients in India. We care feels humbled to be given this responsibility of reaching our to cancer patients.

During the year 2004 many other funds were created: Edith & John Coutinho Memorial Charity Fund; Dr D Y N Murthy Memorial Fund; Dr Jeanette Pinto Memorial Charity Fund (in favour of Widows); Shirley & Maurice D'Mello Memorial Charity Fund; Rita Nazareth Memorial Charity Fund; Anama Memorial Charity Fund. We Care now has a website: <a href="www.wecaretrust.org">www.wecaretrust.org</a> which was designed by Anupama, Conrad Colaco, Andrew & Roven Misquitha. Some parts of the website are still under construction.

Our volunteers and friends of We Care have been working hard towards raising funds for cost of our programmes. Various activities like conducting mini-fetes, charity-bazars, sweet making, etc. were undertaken by them during the course of the year. We gratefully acknowledge their services and support.

We are grateful to Mrs Beatrice Noronha, Bangalore who has donated her second hand maruthi van to us. The van is extremely useful in transporting our children, persons with disabilities and good from one place to the other.

We Care has also rented out a premises from which it carries out its administration and CBR programme. In order to render better services to the poor and to carry out activities more meaningfully, We Care purchased a property consisting of land and building (1000 sq ft) situated in the locality surrounded by the slums. The place as been christened "PRATIKSHA NIVAS" – A PLACE OF HOPE. Pratiksha Nivas has now become a centre for involving children, women and persons with disability in a more active way. We thank Missionszentrale der Franciskaner, Germany for their assistance in helping us to purchase this place.

We have many people and organizations to thank for their cooperation and participation in our programmes. Secondly, many individuals who participate in our network as staff, volunteers, friends, collaborators, advisors, etc. It would be difficult to list everybody by name. We however wish to thank our office staff and CBR Team for their dedicated and committed services.

Finally, I take this opportunity to thank our Trustees who have generously contributed and supported us with their time, energy, advice and guidance.

Involving ourselves in the CBR programme for persons with disabilities has opened our eyes to new meanings of celebrating Christmas.

We have taken up a new initiative, extending our network of partners, with the Prison Ministry India, to help deserving convicted prisoners to go on parole for 60 to 90 days. We Care will assist the families of these prisoners with the surety deposit needed to be secure the parole. We hope that the parole time spent with their families will help them to get rehabilitated and eventually integrated back into society. .. set prisoners free....

We feel confident that you will continue to encourage our work with your generous donations and support us with your prayers. We rely on your generosity and your good will to carry out programmes that benefit the poor and needy. Educating children, especially girls, is one of the most important focus of our work. We welcome and encourage each of you to take up the education of atleast one child during 2005.

We remember you in our daily prayers. We hope and pray that God Almighty may bless you and your family members in a special way during this season. We also pray that God Almighty may reward your generosity in ways that He knows best.

Once again thanking each one of you, our dear donors, volunteers and friends of We Care for joining hands with us in creating a better world – even if it is in a very small way.
